Westville Police Service members responded to 122 calls for service in the month of March 2021. Of the calls for the month, 48 criminal investigations, 20 other provincial statutes, 6 municipal by-law enforcement, 17 are motor vehicles related and 31 are other calls to service.

On March 23, 2021 Westville Police Service were out on patrol when a resident had approached the police regarding a truck that had been parked for a while at the Irving Mainway located on Cowan Street. Upon further investigation it had been revealed that the truck had been stolen from Quebec. Richibucto R.C.M.P. had been contacted.

3 youth and 2 adults have been arrested on March 4, 2021 in relation to a break and enter at the former Highland Consolidated School located at 2157 South Main Street. The property is owned by the Town of Westville but has been abandoned for some time. Westville Police Service receive about a half dozen calls a year in relation to people trespassing on the property. The Westville Police Service would like to remind the public that it is a crime to trespass on private property and it may result in break and enter charges. The 5 individuals involved in the latest occurrence have been charged and the matter is before the courts.
