Westville Police Service members responded to 101 calls for service in the month of March 2020. Of the calls for the month, 20 criminal investigations, 21 other provincial statutes, 5 municipal by-law enforcement, are 22 motor vehicle related and 33 are other calls to service.

Westville Police Service has been investigating several complaints involving cars speeding and driving reckless on and around Acadia Avenue. There are multiple vehicles being reported of speeding. Westville Police Service conducted several speed radar checks in the area as well as having the Traffic Logic Sign in that area. Westville Police Service would like to remind all drivers that the speed limit with the Town of Westville on all streets is 50km/h. On March 2, 2020 the Westville Police Service responded to a call on Dufferin Street that there were footprints around the property and around the shed. Possibly 2 gas jugs were missing. On March 16, 2020 The Westville Police Service went into emergency mode when the Covid-19 Emergency Act was enabled in the province of Nova Scotia. The Westville Police Service responded to 7 calls related to the Covid-19. The calls ranged from people not isolating upon returning to the province to not social distancing. No tickets were issued at this time.
