Westville Police Service members responded to 120 calls for service in the month of August 2019. Of the calls for the month, 39 criminal investigations, 21 other provincial statutes, 12 municipal by-law enforcement, 19 are motor vehicle related and 29 are other calls to service.

On August 4, 2019 Westville Police Service responded to a call from the Auburn Cemetery. One of the sheds on the property had been broken into and 2 Whipper Snippers were stolen. On August 7 a call came into the department reporting the theft of 4 wicker outdoor chairs that were taken from a property located on Jerry's Lane. Also on August 8 there was a report of a patio table and umbrella stolen from a property on Office Street. Westville Police Services have also received complaints of a couple of cars that were entered at night and things missing. At this time there are no witnesses to these thefts and no suspects for these occurrences. The majority of these thefts are happening at night.
