Westville Police Service members responded to 125 calls for service in the month of April 2021. Of the calls for the month, 47 criminal investigations, 23 other provincial statues, 9 municipal by-law enforcement, 16 are motor vehicles related and 30 are other calls to service.

During the month of April Westville Police Service were answering questions regarding health protocols around the rules and travel during the Covid19 Pandemic. The majority of calls regarding Covid19 are concerning questions regarding travel around the county and the province, who and how many people can attend a residence and calls regarding different individuals and or businesses who they believe to not be following proper protocols. Throughout each month as well the Nova Scotia Department of Public Health working in conjunction with the R.C.M.P. will inform the Westville Police Service of individuals who are required to isolate either due to testing and or travel. The Westville Police Service is never informed whether anyone is positive for Covid19.
